1. Population Needs

1.1 National/local context and evidence base

As part of supporting care at home and keeping Sheffield patients out of hospital, NHS Sheffield CCG is keen to provide for the supply of subcutaneous fluids and drug delivery accessories for patients¹, by arranging reliable supplies on an urgent basis from the Wicker pharmacy.

It is recognised that there can be difficulties in obtaining such items quickly during and out of normal business hours. Community pharmacies do not normally stock subcutaneous drug delivery accessories. The onus is usually on the patient or their representative to search for a provider if the medicine is not available at their regular community pharmacy and cannot be obtained within the time required.

¹ Subcutaneous infusion is indicated for maintaining adequate short term hydration in patients who are unable to take adequate fluids orally or for excessive fluid loss such as through vomiting or diarrhoea

2.2 Local defined outcomes

Improved access for patients and their carers to subcutaneous fluids and drug delivery accessories to ensure receipt of these items in a timely manner.

This service helps to support resilience within urgent care.

3. Scope

3.1 Aims and objectives of service

The aim of the service is to offer assured access to palliative care patients or their representatives to subcutaneous fluids and drug delivery accessories from a centrally located community pharmacy.

3.2 Service description/care pathway

- 3.2.1 The pharmacy will keep a stock of subcutaneous fluids and drug delivery accessories (see Appendix 1) to be available during normal business hours.
- 3.2.2 The pharmacy will provide all items required to the patient or their representative on presentation of a prescription for the fluid and written request for the drug delivery accessories.
- 3.2.3 The pharmacist will provide advice to the patient or their representative on the drugs as necessary.
- 3.2.4 The pharmacy will ensure that there is sufficient stock of all items necessary to meet anticipated need.
- 3.2.5 The pharmacy will ensure that the drip stands are cleaned and wiped down with a suitable surface disinfectant such as Clinell[®] Universal Wipes before re-use.

3.3 Population covered

Patients or their representatives presenting a legitimate prescription for subcutaneous fluids and a written request for the drug delivery accessories.

3.4 Any acceptance and exclusion criteria and thresholds
